15. my dad was a giant of a man, all 5.4" of him & 135 of weight. when he said I will pay you Friday at 5PM He would be there and pay up. His word was his bond.

Dad was good at a lot of things, one of his best was stacking bundle Feed like corn, or maize - or Hi Beans. HE WOULD take bundles of this 3- to 4, long and would make a base bottom 12ft wide 20' long and stack up to 10' High and when he had finished it at the top, it would be about 6' wide at the top, and it would be water tight. During the 1930's - when other men worked for a \$1.00 A Day. He made 2.50 per day.

16. Granddaddy Atlaway - was a leader of men she would take the lead and see the job was done right.
